Newsletter

I will be sending home a monthly newsletter on before the lst of the month. The newsletter will include information about what we are studying in class, important dates, reminders, and special events like birthdays.

Progress Reports

Your child will be assessed monthly on what we are learning. You will receive that report at the end of each month. A "report card" will go home at the end of each semester. Please look over your child's work that he/she brings home daily to stay informed on their academic achievements and struggles.

Take Home Folder

Classroom Expectations

In order for every child to succeed it is important that our classroom run smoothly and have minimal disruptions. I do my best to make my expectations clear so that every child understands what is acceptable in our classroom. Showing kindness is our number one goal. Your child will be expected to

- Show kindness to their classmates by leaving their hands to themselves and using only encouraging and helpful words.
- Show kindness to their teachers and adults in the building by being respectful and following classroom/school rules.
- Show kindness to the school by respecting the items we have in the classroom as well as taking care of their personal items.
 - Show kindness to themselves by having a growth mindset and knowing they can do hard things.

In return I promise to

- Show kindness to your child by understanding/supporting your child's needs both academically and emotionally.
- Show kindness by listening to your child and giving them a voice
 - Show kindness by listening to you and your concerns

If there is an issue at school I do my best to follow this plan First offense: correct the behavior by reminding the student of the classroom expectations.

Second offense: correct the behavior again and warn student that if he/she chooses to continue an appropriate consequence will be given

Third offense: I will follow through with the consequence that was stated during the second offense.

If the issue continues or the behavior was major and not minor, then I will be contacting you for us to find a solution together.
